Progress In Driving Down Alcohol Crashes and Fatalities

2010 – 12,429 Crashes 459 fatalities 2009 – 12,550 crashes 474 fatalities 2008 - 12,937 crashes 561 fatalities









31 percent of driver deaths in 16-20 age group were drinking; up from **27 percent in 2009**





17- and 18-year old drivers have the highest percentage involvement in crashes
