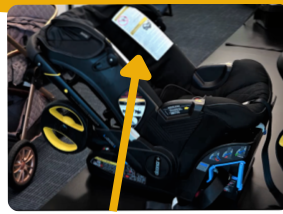

Is your car seat approved?

Look for the labels and the car seat instruction manual before buying or using a car seat to transport your child. Non-compliant and counterfeit car seats are advertised and sold online on many ecommerce platforms.

- Approved car seats meet all United States Safety Standards.
- Non-compliant car seats do not meet the United States Safety Standards, this includes car seats manufactured for other countries.
- Counterfeit car seats are made with cheaper materials and untested designs, making the products unsafe.
- Pennsylvania law states that car seats used to secure children in vehicles must meet US Safety Standards.

Tips to Ensure a Car Seat Meets Safety Requirements and Pennsylvania Law

Car seats that meet safety requirements have an instruction manual and a registration card.

Required Labels on Car Seats

Statement: "This child restraint system conforms to all applicable Federal motor vehicle safety standards".

- If a label with this statement is not present on the car seat, the car seat is non-compliant and could be counterfeit.

Basic Instructions for Correct Use and Installation



This child restraint system conforms to all applicable Federal motor vehicle safety standards. **When used with the harness system: This Restraint is Certified for Use in Motor Vehicles and Aircraft. When used without the harness system as a belt positioning booster: This Restraint is Not Certified for Use in Aircraft.**

Child restraints could be recalled for safety reasons. Register your child restraint so you can be notified in case of a recall. • Snugly adjust the belts provided with this child restraint around your child when used with the 5-pt harness. • Secure the top anchorage (tether) strap provided with this child restraint in forward-facing harness and highback booster modes only. • Use only the vehicle's lap and shoulder belt system when restraining the child in this child restraint booster mode. • Secure your child restraint with the vehicle's lower anchors of the child restraint anchorage system (LATCH system) to attach this child restraint when restraining a child weighing more than 18.1 kg (40 lbs) with restraint and in the written instructions located on the sides of the seat. • Register your child restraint with the manufacturer. • The restraint system must be rear-facing position when used with an infant. • Only use this child restraint on forward-facing vehicle seats equipped with a vehicle seat belt or a lower universal anchorage system. • Never leave child unattended. • Adjust car seat recline to position 5 or 6 when using in forward facing or booster mode.

FORWARD-FACING USE REQUIREMENTS
 13.6 - 29.4 kg (30 - 65 lbs) and 89 - 124 cm (35 - 49 in) and at least 2 years old.

DO NOT install by this method for a child weighing more than 18.1 kg (40 lbs).

Top of ears must be below top of headrest.
 Chest clip at armpit level.
 Buckle Strap in Outer slot.

Shoulder straps must be at or just above child's shoulders.

⚠ WARNING

DO NOT place rear-facing child seat on front seat with air bag.
DEATH OR SERIOUS INJURY can occur.
 The back seat is the safest place for children 12 and under.

Airbag WARNING Label on Rear-Facing Car Seats

Car seats should not be used if they are missing the required warning and safety labels, or have labels that are poorly worded with grammatical errors.

Basic Instructions for correct use include:

- Child weight and height ranges for each mode of use:
 - Rear-Facing
 - Forward-Facing
 - Booster Seat
- Basic Installation Instructions:
 - Seat Belt or LATCH

Seat Selection and Use

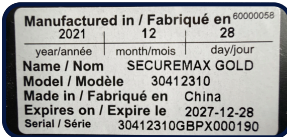
Information included on the side of car seat:

- Weight and Height
- Basic Use and Installation Instructions



- Wording that states the car seat meets Federal safety standards
- Car Seat Manufacturer Name, Address, and US Phone Number

Model Number and Date of Manufacture



Information included on the side of car seat:

- Limited written information
- Use of pictures to provide instructions



Air Bag Warning for Rear-Facing Car Seats

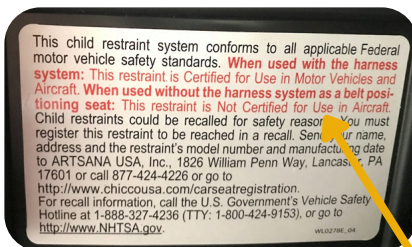


Required air bag warning for all car seats that can be used rear-facing.

Use on Aircraft



Counterfeit Car Seats



- Unknown Brand Name
- Missing Labels
- Grammatical Errors or Foreign Languages on the Labels

- No Instruction Manual
- No Registration Card
- Lightweight Plastic that Bends Easily



If you feel like you might have a non-compliant or counterfeit car seat:

- Contact the car seat manufacturer's customer service by phone or through their website.
- STOP using your car seat, borrow one from a friend or purchase a new approved car seat.
