School Bus Safety For Back to School



- 1. Make sure all drawstrings, ties, straps and scarves are removed or shortened. Reason: They could catch in bus doors or railings.
- 2. Use sidewalks when available and cross at corners and crosswalks. If no sidewalks are available, walk facing traffic as far from the road as possible.

Reason: Walk and cross where drivers expect to see pedestrians.

3. Arrive at the bus stop early and wait for the bus in a safe place away from traffic. Remember no horseplay and respect others.

Reason: You could stumble into the road and be struck by a car.

4. When boarding or exiting the bus, stay in a single file line and hold onto to the handrail. Reason: Hold onto the handrail so that you don't fall.


5. Stay out of the DANGER ZONE.

Reason: The Danger Zone is a 10-foot area around the bus where the bus driver can't see you.

6. While riding the bus, stay seated and facing forward. Keep legs and feet in front of you.

Reason: Stay properly seated in case of a crash and so that you do not trip anyone.

7. Never stick your arms or head out of the bus window. Reason: Buses are wider than cars and come very close to trees and poles. You could be seriously injured.



- 8. Listen to the bus driver. Be courteous to the driver and other students.

 Reason: The bus driver's instructions are for your safety. Use quiet your
 - Reason: The bus driver's instructions are for your safety. Use quiet voices and good behavior so that you do not distract the driver.
- **9.** If you must cross the street, first walk 10 feet (10 giant footsteps) beyond the front of the bus and make sure that the driver can see you with a wave or a signal.

Reason: You should be able to see the bus driver's face and be sure that he sees you before you cross.

10. Remember to always look left, right and left again before crossing and continue to scan the road for traffic while crossing the street.

Reason: Always expect a car, check left, right and left and keep checking. Cars might pass a school bus by mistake.

11. Never run back to the bus even if you have dropped or forgotten something.

Reason: You must stay away from the bus and let the driver, or an adult know that you have dropped something. They can get it for you later.

12. Know where emergency exits are located and review evacuation procedures.

Reason: In an emergency, you will know how to get off the bus safely.
